Thank you to the guild for your support of the classes at the Extension Office. For 2025, we can decide what classes we would like to present - the Extension office is open to any and all ideas! So I would like your input - here are some proposed topics:

- Make a reusable gift bag we would make a wine bottle bag, but the bag can be made to any size. Mary Pacey has offered to teach this class.
- Make a shopping tote tired of the generic shopping bags you have gotten for free along the years? Make one that expresses your personality! Use some favorite fabric, or a bunch of scraps that you haven't been able to use. Cindy Nice has offered to teach this class.
- Learn twilling Linda Hagan will teach this lovely embroidery stitch that adds dimension to any design.
- Repurpose old neckties Mary Pacey has offered to teach a class where people can make a table runner or wall hanging of old neckties.
- Sewing machine notion holder make a small mat with pockets that you can position under your sewing machine to hold all the things you need handy (small scissors, seam ripper, etc.). Mary Pacey has offered to teach this class.
- "Snap" bag repurpose an old tape measure to make a small bag with a closure that
 "snaps" shut! Mary Pacey has offered to teach this class.
- Christmas in July have 3 small projects to demonstrate to attendees that they can
 make for holiday gifts. Similar to our schoolhouse nights. We need instructors and project ideas for this concept.

We would love other ideas for classes! Joy Miller at the Extension office is open to any ideas. They are often looking for smaller projects that people can either complete in the class, or make good progress on during the session. I can help create any materials to hand out to attendees. 

BUSINESS MEETING


